Cats are more likely to be rehomed if they are content in their environment, and members of the public are more likely to visit their local Cats Protection site if it is an enjoyable place to be.

What can you expect to be doing?

- Weeding, planting and preparing pots
- Using tools, gardening equipment and machinery
- Managing our green spaces all year round
