As it's the Little Paws Club we will be looking at cats as pets and how important it is to find the perfect match!



Benji colouring challenge


Colour in the things Benji needs to make him feel at home.

- ✓ A healthy life, with vet trips when needed

Can cats live with other pets?


It depends on the cat. If they got used to other cats or pets as a kitten then they're more likely to be happy living with others as they get older.

The perfect match

Genevieve and her pet cat Zebby

All cats are different so if you're thinking of getting one as a pet, it's important to make sure they're the right match. Different cats suit different owners, for example, Genevieve's cat Zebby alerts her to sounds because she's **deaf**.



When the phone rings or someone's at the door, Zebby taps Genevieve's face or **paces** about in front of her, so she knows to put on her hearing aid. She said: "Without my hearing aid, I can't hear anything, but now I have Zebby to help me."

If there's a sound in the night, Zebby taps Genevieve on the head to wake her and let her know something's up. That's not all Zebby does.

- He helps Genevieve in all sorts of ways:
- he collects the post from the doormat
 - he gets Genevieve's slippers for her

"Zebby is very special, I've never known a cat quite like him," said Genevieve. Zebby has become a perfect partner for Genevieve. What sort of cat would be your perfect match?
